HOW TO DO COLOR



The Real Talk No One Tells You

If you follow me on social media or watch our series, "This Ain't Luck" you know that I had pink hair for most of this past year (now, I have blue hair.) So, I wanted to share the actual process with you in case this is a look you are considering.

FIRST STEP: BLEACH

In order for hair actually accept the colored dye, it needs to be bleached and as blond or white as possible. It's basically the same principal as painting a picture - you start with a white canvas so that the color will pop off - you don't paint on brown or black.

If your hair is dark, it will need to undergo a transformation through bleach. You will need to bleach the part you want colored so that it is very blond or white. This is something you should **ONLY** do with a professional at a salon. Doing bleach yourself can literally result in chemical burns, your hair falling out, etc. Don't try to cut costs here.



This is how light your hair will need to be - before the color goes on.

PAY ATTENTION TO THIS:

Bleach will damage your hair. It will change the way your hair feels. Your hair will be dryer and more "cripsy" feeling. It will break and fall out more easily. Additionally, each hair strand will **EXPAND THREE TIMES** during the bleaching process, so your hair will actually thicken and appear bigger. Sometimes, hair strands become damaged in a way where they begin to stretch, like a bungee cord - and when you brush your hair, the hair stretches and then snaps, resulting in really weird curly tangles. **BE AWARE.**

STEP TWO: COLOR

Once your hair is nice and light colored, it is time for color.

Now, this is the part you can start to cut costs on - if you want to.

There are a lot of color-depositing shampoo and conditioners available. This means you won't actually need to pay to dye your hair, which can be more expensive - you can just buy an at-home product that you will continue to use to WASH your hair to keep the color fresh.

If you want to use actual dye, BE AWARE that it will fade. You should invest in some good color depositing conditioner that matches your color. Then, you will be able to save some cash by needing less trips to keep it vibrant. The best brand on the market is Overtone, followed by KeraColor. Check them out! Also beware - many colored conditioners will contain cancer-causing chemicals.

REAL TALK WRAP UP:

This is by no means an "easy" look to keep up. It will continue to take work and effort, time, and money to keep it up. If you want a really cool look that will always have people saying "I Love Your Hair!" then it's worth it. If you don't like extra effort for your look, avoid this style, because you'll need to do some kind of maintenance or else you quickly start to look ragged or homeless.





CHAINS:

BIG ASS CHAINS

This is a big flex choice. By wearing a big chain, you are automatically flexing and drawing attention to yourself. These chains are larger than life and typically made with oversized gold links. There is a metaphorical angle to the big chain - maybe, before, you were in chains - now you have conquered and taken the chains back and are wearing them as a trophy. Big ruler and boss energy. Just make sure you back up the choice with swag and other wardrobe choices - as you can see, everyone typically does more understated clothing looks with a big chain so they don't look like cartoon character.

CHAINS


THIN + DELICATE

This style is understated and practical, adding a little bling to your look without a big heavy chain.

Typically laying on top of the shirt or top, many rappers layer thin chains, even tucking some in under the shirt.

Variations: links, twists, small pendants or pieces, plain small link chains.

Colors: Gold, Silver, Chrome, Platinum





CHAINS

NAME CHAINS

This style is popular for a reason - people can immediately identify you, and it's a celebration of your brand and your artist name. However, it will be slightly more expensive since you will need to have it custom made.

Variations: diamonds, chrome, gold, rhinestones, gems, glass

Colors: Gold, Silver, Chrome, Diamonds, Colored Diamonds or Gems



CHAINS

PENDANTS

This style uses a larger designed pendant on the end of a chain. These kinds of pendants can be your logo and often have a simpler design (gold or silver only) with a twisted or large linked chain.

Variations: gold, silver, chains, metal pendant - square/circle

Colors: Gold, Silver, Chrome



CHAINS

WEIRD CHAINS

This style is a flamboyant take on the chain - creating the weirdest stuff possible using stones, gems, and diamonds. Cartoon characters like the Simpsons or Rugrats are popular, while others go for literal objects or people. This is definitely something to save for later unless you have a friend who makes these or you can make them yourself. It's a big spend, and you don't need to be flexing like that yet - but keep an eye out for cool designs and things you'd like to develop for yourself with a jeweler in the future. If you're really into this look, check out King Ice's HipHop Pendants.

Variations: designs: humans or characters, cartoons

Colors: Gold, Silver, Chrome, Diamonds, Colored Diamonds or Gems, Paint

COLORFUL

If you are going along the colorful style, colorful grillz may be perfect for you. They are loud and make a huge statement - definitely The Jester in terms of archetype! There's a ton of options in terms of enamel vs. crystals/diamonds. Rainbow color schemes are popular, but you can choose any colors you want. Work with a designer or look online for options.

DIAMONDS

Diamond grills are another big flex! If you can afford these, you're lucky - because they cost a pretty penny! However, you can definitely re-create this look on a budget with rhinestones and other clear crystal designs. While people will probably know they are fake, it's more about the look itself. This look adds a lot of sparkle and pizzazz.

Variations: full diamond or small diamonds arranged together

Colors: Diamonds/Sparkles/Clear





GRILLZ

GOLD

Gold grillz are classic for a reason! They look great. Gold looks clean, classic, and rich - without too much fuss or activity. They are an easy way to pump up an outfit.

GRILLZ


SILVER

Silver grillz offer a cooler alternative to the gold (gold is technically a "warm" color, while silver is "cool"). Less flashy than gold or jewels, this piece is more street, less fussy, and says "IDGAF". It's uncomplicated.

There is also a Biblical reference to Silver (Judas betrayed Jesus for 30 pieces of Silver) which adds more meaning to this choice.

GRILLZ

PARTIAL

Partial grillz give you a great opportunity to personalize your mouth bling even more.

This involves choosing grillz for specific teeth! Pick ones on the top, bottom, or both - and mix it up - for an interesting look.

You may look a little like a pirate - so this would be perfect for an outlaw or explorer archetype.

Variations: teeth choice, designs

GRILLZ


BOTTOM ROW


This is a more subtle and understated grill look. Having just a bottom row means it will only be visible sometimes, and it is less "in your face" than a double row of grillz.

It is also more affordable! Getting your grill can be expensive, so a bottom piece is a good place to start if you're really strapped but want that grill now.
